

# Application for a Combat Sport Contest Permit

(Section 40 *Combat Sports Act 2013*)

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- A permit granted under section 41(1) of the *Combat Sports Act 2013 (Act)* is required to hold one or more combat sport contests on the one occasion and at the same venue.
- Only individuals registered under the Act in the applicable promoter class(es) may apply for a permit to hold a contest. Complete section 2 if holding the contest as an officer or employee of a corporation.
- You must notify the Police Area Command in which the contest is to be held prior to submitting the permit application using the *NSW Police Force Notice of Combat Sport Permit Application* form available on the Authority website [sport.nsw.gov.au/combatsports/permits](http://sport.nsw.gov.au/combatsports/permits).
- All applicable sections must be fully completed, and the application must be accompanied by the additional information required in the application.
- Place an X in the appropriate boxes in the application.
- Applications for permits to hold an amateur contest must be accompanied by approval to hold the contest from the appropriate approved amateur body or bodies using the *AAB Contest Permit Approval Form* available on the Combat Sports Authority of NSW (**Authority**) website [sport.nsw.gov.au/combatsports/permits](http://sport.nsw.gov.au/combatsports/permits)
- The promoter of the combat sport contest must ensure that the contest is covered by the insurance policies determined by the Authority and is held in accordance with the requirements of the insurance policies that cover the contest.
- Applicants that submit a duly made application will be issued an invoice to their recorded email address which must be paid no later than 21 days before the contest date.
- The final fight card for the contest must be lodged with the Authority in the manner and form approved by the Authority, not less than 5 days before the contest, or within any shorter period that the Authority may approve.
- Applications must be made to the Authority **not less than 28 days before the proposed contest date** to [combatsports@sport.nsw.gov.au](mailto:combatsports@sport.nsw.gov.au).
