Order of the Combat Sports Authority of NSW
Significant Contest
Exemption from Rules
Newcastle Entertainment Centre – 8 October 2022

The Combat Sports Authority of NSW (**Authority**) has determined that:

(1) Significant Contest Order

The professional boxing contests between Denis Hogan and Sam Eggington for the International Boxing Organisation Super Welterweight World Title to be held at the Newcastle Entertainment Centre, NSW on 8 October 2022 (**Hogan v Eggington Contest**), is deemed to be a '**significant contest**' for the purposes of clause 62(1) of the *Combat Sports Regulation 2014* and *RULE 5: Appointment of International Officials at Professional contests* of the rules made by the Authority under section 107 of the *Combat Sports Act 2013* (**Authority Rules**).

(2) Exemption from Rule 15 – Head Cut Rule

The Hogan v Eggington Contest is exempt from *RULE 15: Head Cut Rule* of the Authority Rules (**Head Cut Exemption**). The limitation to the Head Cut Exemption is that the *Accident Fouls* and *Intentional Fouls* rules of the *IBO Rules And Regulations for Championship Contests* shall apply in place of *RULE 15: Head Cut Rule* of the Authority Rules

(3) Exemption from RULE 16: Three Knockdown Rule

The Hogan v Eggington Contest is exempt from *RULE 16: Three Knockdown Rule* of the Authority Rules.

(4) Exemption from RULE 20: Protective Equipment – gloves

The Hogan v Eggington Contest is exempt from *RULE 20: Protective Equipment – gloves* of the Authority Rules (**Gloves Exemption**). The limitation to the Gloves Exemption is that both Denis Hogan and Sam Eggington must indicate to the combat sport inspector at the weigh in for the Hogan v Eggington Contest that they have seen and agreed to the gloves that their opponent intends to wear.
