

Child safety in sport and recreation

The Child Safe Standards IZ provide a framework for creating child safe organisations IZ. They emphasise the importance of adopting multiple strategies to address child safety.

The Standards are based on the extensive research and consultation by the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. In accordance with the Children's Guardian Act 2019, Sport and Recreation organisations providing services to children 12 are required to implement the Child Safe Standards, under the Child Safe Scheme & (as of 1 February 2022).

Employees and volunteers in child-related organisations have an important part to play in creating child safe organisations 12.

Child-related organisations can now check how they're performing against the NSW Child Safe Standards by using the new Child Safe Self-Assessment Z
