Implementation of recommendations arising from the Review of the *Combat Sports Act 2013*

August 2023

To the combat sports sector.

I am pleased to advise that the NSW Government has supported a series of recommendations made by the Combat Sports Authority of NSW (Authority) arising from the review of the *Combat Sports Act* 2013 (Act) that will promote the health and safety of combatants and reduce regulatory burden.

Implementation of the recommendations are expected to occur in 2024-2025. Implementation of some recommendations is subject to the passing of legislation through the NSW Parliament. The Authority is working with the Office of Sport to progress the drafting of a Bill. Proposed reforms arising from the recommendations include:

- introducing concussion and other serious head injury identification training for all registered persons;
- prescribing circumstances when a contest should be stopped or suspended to promote combatant health and safety;
- accreditation of medical practitioners that attend contests including prescribed training standards and minimum equipment required at a contest;
- introducing a public register of combatants to enable industry participants and promoters to determine if a person is appropriately registered for placement on a fight card;
- introducing promoter and manager registration classes for body corporates while simplifying the number of classes;
- expanding the eligibility criteria to become an approved amateur body; and
- digitising combatant medical records.

I look forward to working with the sector including our newly appointed Industry Advisory Group to introduce the reforms.
